The Course is called 'Basic' Thailand Massage Course, however it is a very comprehensive course and may be challenging at times.

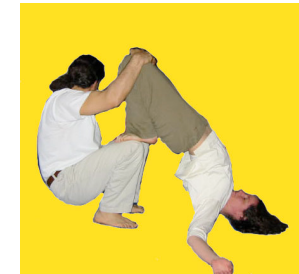


Thailand Massage has received a great deal of publicity in the recent past due to the rise in the popularity of Yoga.
